Safe driving skills and traffic rules

1. You cannot park, stop or stand:

- 1. On a bridge or in a tunnel
- 2. On a sidewalk or in a crosswalk
- 3. Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant, unless you remain in the vehicle
- <u>4. All of the above</u>

Note:

It is illegal to stop or park on a crosswalk, sidewalk, intersection, bridge, tunnel, or at a fire hydrant (if you are not seated in the vehicle).

2. In general, you should pass vehicles going in the same direction:

• <u>1. On the left</u>

- 2. Whenever you have the opportunity to do so
- 3. Only if the other driver signals it is safe
- 4. On the right

Note:

You should always pass the vehicle in front of you on the drivers side (the left side of the vehicle).

3. When passing a vehicle on the left you must:

- 1. Exceed the speed limit
- 2. Do so with caution and only when necessary
- 3. Both 1 and 2
- 4. None of the above

Note:

When passing another vehicle on the left, you must always use caution.

4. What is the difference between a large truck's blind spots and a car's blind spots?

- 1. Larger side mirrors on trucks make their blind spots equal to cars
- <u>2. A truck driver has more and larger blind spots</u>
- 3. The truck driver has smaller blind spots because he is up higher

Note:

The larger the vehicle the greater amount of blind spots and bigger blind spots.

5. An intersection has a stop sign, crosswalk, but no stop line. You should stop:

- 2. With your front wheels in the crosswalk
- <u>3. Before the crosswalk</u>
- 4. Stop or slow down if necessary

Note:

All vehicles are required to stop before the crosswalk.

6. After you have passed a car you should return to the right lane when you:

Before changing lanes you should always use both your mirrors and quickly look over your shoulder to make sure it is safe to do so.

- Note:

Road construction signs are generally Orange and Black.

Note:

On New York State highways where there are no posted speed limit signs the maximum speed limit is 55 mph.

9. Drivers traveling up a hill covered with ice or snow should:

- 1. Gently give the vehicle gas to continue forward, while maintaining enough breaking control to keep the wheels from spinning
- 2. Be prepared to use the emergency brake if needed
- 3. Both 1 and 2
- 4. Rev the engine and try to drive quickly up the hill

Note:

When traveling on wet or snow covered roads/hills it is important to maintain a slow, safe and stable driving speed.

10. When may you pass a vehicle which has stopped at a crosswalk to allow a pedestrian to cross?

Note:

Pedestrians have the right of way at a crosswalk.
